Looking Forward to 1955-56

In this final issue of the News Letter for 1954-55 we shall attempt to point out some things which should be kept in mind for the coming year.

In September each member school will receive two copies of the September News Letter which contains a complete report of all of the activities of the year 1954-55. The Constitution and Rules and Regulations for the coming year are also in this issue. With the News Letter you will receive:

Dues should be paid before December 15. when the dues are received a packet of free material is sent to the school. To be certain you receive it in time for the materials to be most useful, pay your dues early. This packet contains:

- 1 copy of Winning Orations
- Copies of new declamations
- Debate Material (if school checks Debate)
- One-Act Play List (if school checks One-Act Pl)
- Lists of declamations available from WHSFA
- Lists of other materials for sale

In October elections are held in districts and sections where terms of the board members have expired. This fall elections will be held in the following districts and sections:

Tape-Recorded Panel Discussions
Made a Regular Contest Activity

Convinced that two years of experimentation with tape-recorded panel discussions have demonstrated the educational value of this activity, the Board of Control unanimously elevated this contest to the same level as drama, debate, and speech. The following rule changes become effective next fall to implement this decision.

IX. Supplementary Rules for Tape-Recorded Panel Discussion.

1. The discussion question for 1955-56 is:
How can extra-curricular activities best contribute to the educational program?
2. Each member school may enter one discussion team.
3. Each discussion team will consist of a student moderator, and at least three and no more than four discussants.
4. Each discussion team shall tape record a twenty-minute roundtable discussion on a single-track tape at 3.75 or 7.5 inches per second. However, the 7.5 speed is preferable.
5. Students may use notes or reference material, but the use of scripts is forbidden.
6. All tapes will be sent to the state office, where they will be divided by lot into sub-groups. The number of sub-groups will be left to the discretion of the Secretary-Treasurer. These groups will be judged by one judge each.
7. The highest ranking schools in the sub-groups shall be given certificates of merit. These certificates shall be provided by the state office. Recipient schools to enter specific data on the forms provided.

8. No more than four teams will enter the final contest. Three judges shall be used in the final contest.
9. Judges will be asked to submit brief written comments for each discussion on forms provided by the state office.

The registration fee shall be five dollars per school. A school plaque will be given the winner and certificates of merit will to to schools placing second, third, and fourth. Members of the first-place team will be awarded gold medals, second place team silver medals, and third place teams bronze medals.

Other rule Changes for 1955-56

The Board changed Supplementary Rule III, 6, to read:

An alternate may be present in the room but may not sit at the table and may not participate in the debate in any way except in case of illness of a debater.

The first sentence of Supplementary Rule III, 10, was changed to read:

All Schools which qualify to pass from the district to the sectional and from the sectional to the state debate contests shall be given certificates of merit. (remainder unchanged.)

The following sentences were added to Supplementary Rule III, 8c:

Second place shall go to the next highest ranking school and all tied with it. Third place shall go to the next highest ranking school and all tied with it.

In an effort to make more uniform the sequence of preliminary drama and debate contests engaged in by member schools in all parts of the state and at the same time to recognize unique conditions which exist in some of our districts, the board approved the following new rule, effective September 1, 1955:

Supplementary Rule I, 7.h. If there are 3 or fewer schools in drama or debate in any district, those schools will enter directly into the sectional contest. If there are four or more schools participating in drama or debate in any district, those schools must participate in a district contest.

Changes in The Speech Contest

Narrative poetry will be used in place of the Reader's Digest in the Extemporaneous Reading Contest next spring, following action taken by the Board of Control in its March meeting. Many coaches have expressed an interest in encouraging a broader appreciation of poetry and the Board believes that this event will promote this objective. Watch for the rules of this contest which will appear in the September News Letter.

The Board also voted to add an eighth event--the interpretative reading of prose or poetry from the printed page with the optional use of a reading stand. This decision was made in response to many demands to incorporate a contest which some believe to be more typical of the demands of adult life than the memorized events.

The rules for this contest will appear in the September News Letter and helpful advice on the preparation for it will be included in the 1955 edition of AIMS AND PURPOSES which will be distributed in the fall.

Last Year's Institute Pattern to Continue

The success of last year's institute pattern offered a clear mandate to the Board of Control to attempt a similar program for 1955-56. This past year eleven institutes held at nine state colleges served over 2700 students from 175 high schools. This is a record of which the colleges and the Association can be justly proud.

The district chairmen are to approach the colleges to discover if the college staffs are willing to sponsor one or more institutes this coming year and, if so, to work out the details following some common guide lines approved by the Board.

We hope to announce the schedule for these institutes in the September News Letter.

One-Act Play Contest

Drama work should begin early in the school year since the name of the play to be used in the drama contest must be registered with the secretary-treasurer on or before October 15th. A new list of Approved Plays 1955 (green cover) is being sent to each member school with this News Letter. Please discard all old play lists you may have in your library as some of the plays have been discontinued and some new ones have been added. Do not use any list which does not have Wisconsin High School Forensic Association--1955 on the cover.

We cannot stress too often or too much the importance of selecting a play long before it is to be produced. Selections made under pressure, or under requirement to meet a deadline, are seldom wise selections.

Another Light on the Copyright Law

In the November 1952 News Letter we printed an excerpt of an amendment to the copyright law which has resulted in many of us becoming very much concerned that neither we nor our students get ourselves in a position of violating the letter or spirit of the law.

A further study of the background of this amendment suggests we may have been overly concerned with the implications to our program of the addition to the law. It was clearly designed to extend to performance for profit the same protection the owner enjoyed in its publication. It appears the intent of Congress was not to label the reading of copyrighted material an infringement upon the copyright unless some sort of monetary reward accrued to the reader or his sponsor.

It is, therefore, our interpretation that students may use copyrighted material for the normal purposes of our association without securing permission from the copyright owner if no "profit" is involved. We think this interpretation rules out the use of these materials in any type of program for which admissions are charged or at which collections are taken, whether the proceeds go to the school or to the individual.

Readers are urged to remember that this is a lay rather than a legal opinion. If you wish to check this interpretation with the source of our information, we refer you to the United States Code, Congressional and Administrative News, 1952, 82nd Congress, 2nd Session, Chapters 669-951, pages 3825-4649, particularly pages 1313 ff and 2307-10.

State Speech Contest

Each year for as long as we have been editing these News Letters we have been able to report that "this was the largest contest in the Association's long history." This statement can be used again as 809 contestants from 312 schools participated in the contest held April 16 at the University of Wisconsin. It was quite obvious that the new rule limiting each school to two entries in each event of league speech contests did not accomplish the purpose of the Board of Control--namely, to reduce the size of the state contest. While two districts sent fewer contestants than last year, the others sent more. If the members of the association, as represented by the Board of Control, wish to limit the size of these growing state contests, at least two alternatives present themselves--one to limit the number of contestants each school may enter in each event of league contests to one, the other to schedule sectional speech contests. What do you think should be done? Or do you favor a large state contest? Please let your district and sectional chairmen know.

Another trend which is very apparent is the growing percentage of A's and the shrinking percentage of C's given at the state contest. (See table on page 11 prepared by Dr. Herman H. Brockhaus.) Several interpretations may be given to these figures in the absence of any objective information. Perhaps the teaching of speech has tremendously improved in the last eight years, both as to quality and the number of high school students given the advantage of speech training. Perhaps speech activities are attracting more and more of our better students. Perhaps the standards of judging are less stringent. Perhaps our judges feel that in a final contest it is only reasonable

that excellence is the rule rather than the exception. Maybe there are others.

This year 850 students received A's in the district contests and qualified to enter the state. Of that number, 809 actually participated. 385 received A's, 402 were awarded B's, and 22 were given C's. Two students were disqualified for not meeting the requirements of the rules.

The September News Letter will list titles of the selections used. Medals won at the state contest have been mailed out and all schools should have received them by now.
