Looking Forward to 1950-51

In this final issue of the News Letter for the current school year we shall attempt to point out things which should be kept in mind for the coming year. Here are some of the things to anticipate:

In September each member school will receive two copies of the September News Letter which contains a complete report of all contests held during the year 1949-50, the constitution, and rules and regulations for the coming year 1950-51. You will also receive a statement for dues, a registration card, and a blank for ordering forensic materials. Dues should be sent in on or before December 15th.

When the dues are received, a packet of free material is sent to the school. This contains a copy of Winning Orations, the new declamations prepared for the year, debate material (if the school checks debate on the registration card), drama material (if the school checks drama on the registration card), and lists of orations and declamations available from the state office.

In October, elections are held in districts and sections where terms of the Board members have expired. This fall, elections will be held in the following districts:

In November the Board of Control and the Ass'n will hold meetings in Milwaukee. These meetings are held at the time of the Wisconsin Education Ass'n meeting. Each member school is invited to send a representative to the Association meeting to present any problems, questions, or suggestions.

Drama work should begin early in the school year since the name of the play to be used in the drama contest must be registered on or before October 15th. A new list of APPROVED PLAYS 1950 is being sent out with this News Letter. If you still have your old play list, now is the time to discard it since many of the plays on it have been taken off. We can not stress too often or too much the importance of selecting a play long before it is to be produced. Selections made under pressure, under requirements to meet a deadline, are rarely good selections. It is most important that the choice be made as early as possible in the season and not be postponed until three weeks before the date of the contest.

At the March meeting of the Board of Control, the rule that one-act plays must be taken from the APPROVED LIST was amended by adding the words "except that any school may enter a one-act play--original to the students and faculty of that school--which has been presented to the advisor in drama, Mr. R. E. Gard, for his approval, by October 1st and for which final approval has been granted by October 15. Schools planning to enter original scripts should begin now to prepare the copy.

A Summary of the Declamation Survey
of Twenty-Four Leading Schools

1. Do you emphasize interpretation (reader type) or impersonation (acting character type) in coaching declamation?
Summary Answer: Interpretation, seven schools;
Impersonation, five schools; both, five schools
2. Does your school maintain a rather comprehensive file of declamations for the students to choose from?
Yes: Fourteen Schools. No: Nine schools
3. Do you insist on a firm and guiding hand in the choice of the declamation?
Yes: Ten schools No: Fourteen schools
4. Do you block out the bodily action or guide the student in his pre-planned gestures?
Yes: Eleven schools No: Thirteen schools.
5. Do you frequently use play or novel cuttings arranged by you or the student as declamations?
Yes: 20 schools No: Four schools
6. How many times in the coaching of a declamation do you hear the student?
Summary answer: One school answers fifty times;
eleven schools answer twenty-five times; eight
schools answer fifteen times; three schools
answer ten times.

7. Do you emphasize the use of narrative material or characterization in the declamations your students present?
Narrative: None
Characterization: Fourteen Schools
Both: Ten schools
8. Do you choose your school's representatives in a school contest?
Yes: Twenty-four schools No: None

Outsiders: Twelve schools

Is it a public contest in the evening?

9. Do you use dialect selections for declamations which demand at least partial impersonation frequently?

11. Where do most of the contest declamations you use come from?
Edna Means: Eleven schools

12. In coaching declaimers, do you actually demonstrate the presentation of the selection?
Yes: Twelve schools No: Twelve schools
13. Are your declaimers frequently people who have had previous practice in interpretation in speech or dramatics classes?
Yes: Fifteen schools No: Nine schools
14. How do you persuade your students to avoid the melodramatic, the vulgar, the tear-jerker, or the slapstick?
Summary of the Comments: By firm guidance or not having such selections in the school file.
15. Would you recommend any changes in our present declamation contests, and if so, what?
Thirteen schools indicated no change. Remaining schools suggest interpretation and impersonation divisions, smaller contest sections, and written judges' criticisms.
16. Would you recommend any changes in our present method and basis for judging declamation contests?
Thirteen schools are satisfied with the present method. Other comments: More expert judges, set a standard list of objective judging criteria, and judges should give constructive suggestions after the contest.
17. Do you teach your declaimers to turn (either body or head) from side to side in placing their characters? Yes: Eighteen Schools No: Three schools
Three schools answer: it depends on selection and student.
18. Do you present monologues frequently as declamations? Yes: Seven schools No: Twelve schools
Sometimes: Five schools

19. Do you feel that the declaimer should present his declamation directly to the audience as a story teller would with only suggestive action and vocalization, or with strong characterization, posturing, distinct voice changes and everything but the stage movement of actors?
Story-Teller: Eight schools Actor: Four schools.
Depends on Selection and Student: Ten schools.
20. Do you allow stage directions, scene explanations, or transitions of time and character explanations to be interspersed between the dramatic scenes?
Yes: Nineteen schools No: Three schools
21. Which of the following qualities would you say are most necessary for success in declamation?
Sixteen schools underlined Good Vocal Quality, Pitch, and Flexibility;
Sixteen schools underlined Dramatic Imagination;
Four schools underlined good Enunciation; One school underlined Impressive Appearance; One school underlined Graceful Bodily Action; Three schools underlined Ability as a Story-teller;
Seven schools underlined Expressive Face; Eight schools underlined Ability to Present Strong characterizations; Eleven schools underlined a sense of Timing.
22. Please name three of your most successful humorous declamations. Those listed most often were:
The Education of Hyman Kaplan, Snoopopaths,
and The Treasurer's Report.
23. Would you say the appeal of your humorous declamations is to adult humor or to high school humor?
Adult: Nine schools Student: Seven schools
Both: Four schools.

25. Do you present interpretation programs or declamations, and work on them in or out of class at other times of the year other than the forensic season?
Yes: Eleven schools No: Eleven Schools

This summary of the answers to Mr. Smith's questionnaire—which was sent out to twenty-four schools having been most successful in forensic achievement—is offered in the hope that it may prove helpful to the beginning declamation coach. Additional parts of the thesis, dealing with other phases of forensics will be given in later news letters.
