A Letter from the Chairman

Dear Administrator:

The WHSFA will take a big step toward becoming more self-supporting as a result of action taken at the March meeting of the Board.

Our Association has enjoyed a partial subsidy from the University throughout its quarter-century existence. The University has contributed the professional services of the secretary-treasurer and assistant secretary-treasurer; a large portion of the time of a stenographer; and office space and equipment. The Association has paid for supplies and student help.

Current strains on the University budget have caused Director L. H. Adolfson of the Extension Division to try to raise the percent of self support of the Bureau of Information and Program Services which houses the WHSFA.

This matter was discussed by the Board at its November meeting and referred to a committee which met with Director Adolfson. The situation was considered from every angle in a very frank and friendly way. It was felt that our membership would accept the case of the University that while professional help might be provided by the University, the WHSFA should pay for clerical services. This policy would be more consistent with the relationships of the University to the WSMA and the WIAA.

As a result of this conference, the committee recommended that the Board approve the request of the University of Wisconsin Extension Division that the WHSFA reimburse the University for that part of the stenographer's salary proportionate to the amount of her time spent on WHSFA activities; that

this be done in one step during the fiscal year of 1957-58; and that the additional income be raised by a flat increase of \$6.00 in each of the three membership categories. This recommendation was unanimously approved.

We have full confidence that the membership of WHSFA will accept this decision of the Board and continue their participation in our growing program.

Marquette and St. Catherine's 1957 State Debate Champions

A school that's making a habit of winning the state debate contest and another that is just completing its first year in the Forensic Association shared honors by winning every one of their eight debates in the state finals, March 1-2, in Madison. Milwaukee Marquette has either won or tied for first in four of the last five state contests. St. Catherine's just joined the Association last fall.

Second place, with a 7-1 record went to Kenosha. New London and Two Rivers shared third place with five wins and three losses each.

Chairman Kenneth Curran of the Board of Control presented the awards in a brief ceremony Saturday noon. Professor Andrew Weaver was the main speaker at a dinner Friday evening for all of the debaters, coaches, and judges. Dr. Weaver, who has been the Association's advisor in Speech for over 30 years spoke on the subject "Understanding—and Mis-Understanding."

Mary Anne Smoler of Kenosha Wins Hamilton Scholarship

After five gruelling rounds of extemporaneous speaking, Mary Anne Smoler of Kenosha High School has emerged as state winner of the \$1,000 Hamilton Bi-centennial Scholarship and Wisconsin representative to the American Students Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia, June 18-21. (See September Newsletter, pp. 8-10.)

Three other finalists were certified as alternates to the Philadelphia convention in the order they ranked: second, Roger Stauter, Grantsburg; third, Calvin Kreunen, Bangor; fourth, Fred Van Remortel, Ashland DePadua. Designation of the scholarship winner was based not only on the final round presentation, but also on the speaker's accumulated ratings throughout the day.

Thirty-six extemp speakers, winners of "A" ratings in the state speech contest on April 13, returned to Madison April 27th to vie for the scholarship. The final round was held as part of the program at the Awards Dinner that evening, paid for by the Madison Capital Times. At that time, each contestant was presented with a new billfold or purse as a gift from the Enger-Kress Leather Company of West Bend.

In achieving her victory, Miss Smoler not only ranked first in the final round but placed first in her section in three of the four qualifying rounds. The five topics on which she spoke during the day were: The Teamster Union Probe, the Eisenhower Doctrine, Integration in the Public Schools, the Status of U. S. Defenses, and the Problem of Presidential Succession.

Judging Method Changed For Discussion Contest

The rank order method of judging used in the tape-recorded discussion contest since its inception in 1954 will be abandoned this year in favor of A, B, and C ratings. The change was prompted by the feeling of the Board that the evaluation of this event should reflect the quality of the students! efforts to deliberate cooperatively, and that such an evaluation is not best made through the competitive nature of the rank order method of judging. This will make the discussion contest judging consistent with the other events of the Association and eliminate the circumstance which made it impossible for a #2 rated discussion in one section to advance to the finals even though it may have been of better quality that the #1 rated group in another section. All "A" rated schools in the final round will receive a school plaque and individual medals will be awarded to the participants.

Material Change For Extemp Readers

EDITORIALS will be the "order of the day" for extemp readers during the coming year. This is in keeping with the Board's policy to periodically review the rules for this event and expose extemp readers to a variety of literature types. During the past ten years, for example, material for this contest has included biographical prose, Reader's Digest and Coronet articles, American folklore prose, and narrative poetry.

Suggested sources for the EDITORIAIS to be used in the coming year will be included in the September Newsletter.

Board Approves Two New Contests Radio--And Play Reading--To Be Tried

Keeping up with the times, providing opportunity for new kinds of speech experiences, and making possible an even broader participation are, to be sure, some of the factors that motivated Board thinking in the direction of experimenting with two new contests in 1957-58.

A TAPE RECORDED RADIO PROGRAM CONTEST, run similar to our current tape-recorded discussion contest, will be conducted experimentally next fall. This event will provide schools that have radio clubs or classes, or that present regular radio shows over some local station, or that are interested in experimenting with the radio approach to speech improvement, with a chance to have their programs compared with others and evaluated by experts in the field. The state office will administer this contest and entries will be sent there directly. Plans call for a specified program theme which will vary from year to year, one 14 minute entry per school, and no limitations on cast size.

A PLAY READING EVENT will be added to the spring speech contest. This activity will involve the non-memorized presentation of a play cutting, not to exceed 15 minutes in length, by a cast of 2-5 characters. No properties(except for optional use of reading stands) will be allowed. Each school will be limited to one entry and individual medals will be given to each person in the cast at the state contest.

Details and rules of both of these events will be printed in the September <u>Newsletter</u> and a full description with preparation suggestions will be included in the revised edition of <u>Aims</u>, <u>Purposes</u>, and <u>Definitions</u>.

New Play List Enclosed

"Approved Plays-1957" is being sent to you with this issue of the NEWSLETTER. You will notice the inclusion, for the first time, of a considerable number of three-act-plays with SUGGESTIONS for cuttings you might use in the one-act-contest. Please read the information on the cover of the play list very carefully.

Remember that October 15 is the deadline for registering the name of your play with the sec'ytreas. at the state office. (For approval.)

Need to Hold District Contest? New Rule is Flexible

Persistent efforts have been made in recent years to establish a uniform policy regarding how many schools must participate in drama and debate at the district level to require holding a contest. Setting the number required to hold a district contest at four in 1956, and at six in 1957, has not worked out practically. After considerable discussion, the Board has decided to change Standing Rule I-7, h, to read: "Whether or not there shall be district contests in drama and debate in a section shall depend upon the judgement of the sectional and district chairmen involved as to the need for them. In case of a tie, the Sectional chairman shall decide."

New Topic Source in Extemp Speaking

Due to the impending disconued publication of New Republic, the Board has designated the magazine The Reporter to be used in its place as a source of topics for extemp speaking. Other periodicals on the list (September Newsletter) will continue to be used.

State Drama Contest Headed North

At its spring meeting, the Board of Control accepted the invitation of Earl Kjer, Theatre Director at Eau Claire State College, to hold the 1957 State One-Act Play Contest in Eau Claire.

This move was prompted, in part at least, by the drama coaches themselves. The state office had received so many requests to arrange for facilities other than Bascom Theatre, that a poll of drama coaches was taken last January, offering several alternatives.

The Memorial Union Theatre will not be available at the <u>usual</u> time of the state contest which accounts for the phrasing of these alternatives:

- 1. The Saturday of the Thanksgiving weekend in the Union Theatre.
- 2. The 3rd or 4th Saturday in January in Union.
- 3. At the usual time (2nd weekend in Dec.) but in some of the newer high school or college theatres throughout the state.
- 4. Continue the present policy.

The results of the poll indicated a preference for the third alternative and brought about Board acceptance of Mr. Kjer's invitation. The date for this event has been set as December 7.

Board Votes Production Time Limit on One-Acts

"Production time shall not exceed 35 minutes."
So ruled the Board of Control at its March 14
meeting in order to bring about adherence to what
had previously been a "suggested" time limit. The
new ruling further states: "The contest chairman
shall appoint an official timekeeper who shall be
stationed backstage and should order the curtain
pulled at the end of the 35 minutes. Being stopped
shall in no way affect the rating."

State Speech Contest

1957 marked the first year in which the "C" rating was not used in spring speech contests above the league level. The new rule did not result in the flooding increase of "A's" many anticipated. 1,004 students, only 15 more than in 1956, received A ratings at the district level and thereby qualified for the state event. Of these, 974 actually participated. 529 (54%) received "A" awards and 445(46%) received "B" awards.

The September Newsletter will list titles of the selections used. All of this year's state contest participants should have received their medals by this time.
