State Speech Festival Numbers

For all you coaches that love numbers as much as I do, let me tell you about the 2013 State Speech Festival in Madison.

This year we had 483 coaches register their entries on the web site – up 15 schools from last year.

3,351 entries with 4,847 students were scheduled for State Speech.

This year we used 16 more judges bringing the number of judges to 543.

For the first time since 1990, some schools from the north were unable to make it to the festival.
