Wisconsin State Theater Festival a Success

There were 39 schools presenting their One Act Plays at the State Theater Festival this year involving 940 students. The number of schools presenting at the State Theater Festival was down from the year before but the judges felt that the

quality of the productions was over-all higher.

Sixty nine schools began producing One Act Plays in the Fall. A total of 1,459 students were involved in productions.

"Book A Slot for State" January 20, 2014

Six Groups Allowed for Speech

Again this year a school may enter six groups between Play Acting and Group Interpretation but no more than four in either category. If you wish to enter six groups, you must schedule your school for a Saturday round. A school may only have a maximum of 25 entries.

Twelve Entries Allowed for Prose, Poetry and Farrago

Schools may enter 12 students between Prose Reading, Poetry Reading and Farrago but may not exceed four in any one category. A school still may only have a total of 25 entries.

Speech Adjudicator Certification

Please make sure that your Adjudicator Certification is current if you plan to do any judging during 2014. If yours has expired, please send an e-mail to the State Office – director@whsfa.org – and request a recertification test. It will then be sent to your via return e-mail. Completed tests need to be sent to the State Office via snail mail with the \$5.00 recertification fee.
