

The fourteenth annual Wisconsin High School Theatre Festival, "Celebrate Theatre!", produced by the Wisconsin High School Forensic **UW-Madison** Association. Department of Liberal Studies and the Arts and the Alliance for Wisconsin Theatre Education was a tremendous success! This outstanding 2004 Theatre Festival was hosted by UW-Whitewater on November 18, 19 and 20, 2004.

The 2004 theatre extravaganza opened on Thursday evening with a terrific Showcase performance of Gilbert and Sullivan's rollicking operetta "The Pirates of Penzance." This outstanding production was performed by Dominican High School, Whitefish Bay, and directed by Jeff Schaetzke.

Friday's Showcase production was Of Thee I Sing. This classic Pulitzer Prize winning show was directed by Steve Nibbe and performed by talented students from Verona Area High School. Special applause goes out to ALL involved in these outstanding productions.

Friday and Saturday offered a number of interesting and educational workshops which covered a wide variety of theatre topics including: Character Auditioning, Musical Improv, Hip-Hop Funk Dance, Improv Comedy, Safe Swordplay and the always popular Tech Olympics. These and many other "hands-on" opportunities for students, teachers and directors



to enhance their theatre skills were a popular part of the event.

Forty-nine (49) selected high schools were invited to showcase their oneact productions at the 2004 State Festival, and performed both Friday and Saturday in the Barnett and Festival theatres. These plays were representative of the outstanding theatre work being done across the state by dedicated students and directors.

Many state colleges and universities, as well as a number of commercial companies were available to display their products and talk to interested students and teachers in the exhibit areas.

Special commendations go to Marshall Anderson, Jim Butchart, Steven Chene', Tom Colwin and Charles Grover from the UW-Whitewater Department of Theatre/ Dance - and to a wonderful group of UW-Whitewater students, whose many efforts made the 2004 Festival a smashing success! Bravo!!

Total attendance at the 2004 Theatre Festival was over 2.500 participants. Make plans now to attend the fifteenth annual Wisconsin High School Theatre Festival, to be hosted by UW-Oshkosh on November 17, 18 and 19, 2005.
