On January 27-29, 2000, UW-Oshkosh and Professor Kay Neal were hosts for the 4- and 2-Speaker WHSFA State Debate Tournaments. The Association extends to the University and Dr. Neal our sincere appreciation for the facility and the expertise which was extended to us for this event.

4-Speaker Division - Fourteen schools entered the 4-Speaker Division. Schools participating were: Brown Deer, Cedarburg, Hudson, Janesville Craig, Juneau Dodgeland, Madison Memorial, Milwaukee Solomon Juneau, Milwaukee Rufus King, Sheyboygan South, Slinger, Stevens Point, Wausau East, Wausau West and Wisconsin Rapids Lincoln.


