SPEECH ADJUDICATION UPDATE

It is not too late to let us know of your interest in hosting an Adjudication Workshop! We take care of all registration and instruction - host provides a room, chalkboard, VCR and monitor. If interested, please contact J. Peter at the State Office.

Schools who do not provide a certified judge for the State Meet in 1994 will be charged \$25.00 for a provided adjudicator.

At the present time, over 900 people have successfully completed the Adjudicator Program. While that may sound as if it is more than sufficient, it isn't. Inability to attend the State Meet, moving to another state or otherwise employed depletes the number of individuals available. If you have not yet enrolled in the course, please consider doing so as soon as possible.

Recertification for individuals initially certified three years ago is in process. Information has been sent to individuals at their last known address asking them to request a recertification self-test and materials if needed. Successful completion of the self-test will result in individuals being certified for a 3-year period. There is no cost to take the speech recertification self-test.

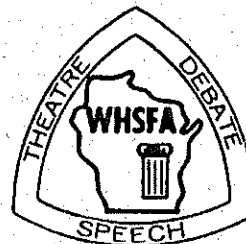

- Other Business Matters:

• Skip Grover, Advisor in Theatre, reported on the Theatre Advisory Committee meeting. Matters regarding theatre critique sheets and medal distribution were also taken under consideration.

- Kay Neal, Advisor in Debate, reported on the activities of the Debate Advisory Committee. She explained the "Michigan Plan". This experimental plan will be used in the 1994 Debate season.
- Michael Price, Advisor in Speech, reported on the Speech Advisory Committee meeting. Public Speaking, Prose and Poetry participants will no longer have to change material between District and State levels of participation.
- Bob DeMuth, DPI representative, announced that November has been declared as "High School Theatre Month".
