Critics are asked to write a review of the play and, when appropriate, note exemplary theatrical-skills by using the special awards. An individual critic can give an "Outstanding Acting" and an "Outstanding Directing" award, but at least two of the critics must agree on the "Critics Choice" award before it is granted.
