



WELCOME TO MEMBERSHIP

Since 1947 one of the pages in the front part of each September issue of the *Newsletter* has carried the heading INVITATION TO MEMBERSHIP. It was an appropriate heading during all the years the *Newsletter* and the membership registration materials were sent out simultaneously, at the start of a new school term.

The old heading would be inappropriate in this issue of the *Newsletter* because a number of schools have already renewed their membership in the Association and have paid their dues for 1968-69. This year, with the approval of the Board of Control, the state office mailed out membership registration cards the middle of July. We hope the early mailing will reduce a bit of the pressure which accompanies the start of every school year. We know it will help distribute some of the work in the state office over a greater span of time.

Most of the schools which have joined, or will join, the WHSFA for 1968-69 have been members of the Association for more than 30 years. The membership roster in the back part of the *Newsletter* not only gives the names of the 465 schools which belonged to the WHSFA last year but also the number of years each has been a member.

Membership in the Association is open to all schools in Wisconsin, public or private, which offer work at the 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade levels. Junior high schools as well as senior high schools may join, but only their 9th grade students may compete in WHSFA contests.

The primary function of the Association, without a doubt, is to conduct the major inter-school forensic contest program in the state. However, the purpose of this program is not simply to name winners. More important is the educational experience gained by the thousands of Wisconsin high school students who participate in debate, drama, and speech contests each year. The participation summaries for 1967-68 on pages 39, 50, and 72 in this *Newsletter* are revealing. The large number of participants, especially at the local level, should dispel any fear that the WHSFA program benefits only a select few.

The nature and quality of the Association's program is the concern of the WHSFA Board of Control. This elected group which determines the policies of the Association is comprised of 12 educators. Nine are high school principals or administrators who serve as chairmen of the nine districts. Three are speech teachers or coaches who function as chairmen of the three sections. As Board members these twelve people establish the policies and rules of the Association. As chairmen of districts and sections they administer those policies and rules which apply to their particular areas.

The principal administrative officer of the WHSFA is the secretary-treasurer, who is responsible for the state office of the Association. He is a faculty member employed and paid by University Extension, which also provides the space and equipment for the office.

Each membership year in the Association begins on September 1 and ends on August 31. Annual dues are payable on or before October 1. The schedule of dues adopted by the Board at its meeting in May 1967 is as follows:

- \$15 for schools with an enrollment of 149 or less
- \$25 for schools with an enrollment of 150 to 349
- \$30 for schools with an enrollment of 350 or more

Money collected in dues is used for a variety of purposes. It pays for: expenses of Board meetings and committee meetings; part of the salary of the stenographer in the state office; publication of four issues of the *Newsletter*, the *Contest Handbook*, *Play List*, and other special pamphlets; purchase of materials for use in contests, especially debate; and the cost of mailing publications and materials to the member schools.

We hope you consider the activities of the Association to be a worthwhile part of your school program. We will be pleased to see the name of your school on the 1968-69 membership roster of the Wisconsin High School Forensic Association.

PART I

GENERAL INFORMATION

ANNUAL DUES MUST BE PAID ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1. THE BOARD OF CONTROL HAS RULED THAT A SCHOOL WHICH FAILS TO PAY ITS DUES BY OCTOBER 1 MAY NOT PARTICIPATE IN ANY ASSOCIATION ACTIVITY.

Membership Registration

Last July each school which was a member of the WHSFA in 1967-68 was sent a set of membership registration cards and a statement requesting payment of dues. When the filled-in cards are received by the state office, one copy is filed and the other is forwarded to the district chairman. Thus both the state office and the district chairman have information about the contest activities a school plans to enter, the names of the coaches in charge, and the payment of dues. The cards are also used in the preparation of state and district mailing lists.

At the start of the school year, members receive the following materials from the state office:

- Four copies of the WHSFA *Newsletter* for September 1968
- Two copies of the WHSFA *Contest Handbook* and *Play List*
- A copy of the *U. S. Riot Commission Report*, for use in the Public Address contest
- Reference material on the debate proposition, if the school indicated on the registration card that it planned to participate in debate
- An order blank for forensic materials

WHSFA Newsletters

The state office publishes a *Newsletter* each year in September, November, February, and May. The September issue contains a record of the previous year's activities, a copy of the constitution of the Association, and the rules under which the contests are conducted. The other three issues include current news items, announcements, and contributed articles.

Districts and Sections

For information about sub-district or district contests, schools are advised to write or phone their district chairman. For information about sectional contests, they should communicate directly with their sectional chairman. The secretary-treasurer of the Association is the person to write or phone concerning state contests.

The roster of schools in the back part of this *Newsletter* shows the districts to which members belong. The names, addresses, and phone numbers of the district and sectional chairmen are on the inside front cover.

Elections of Board Members

Normally, four persons are elected to the 12-member Board of Control each fall. Three are high school principals or administrators elected to be district chairmen: the fourth is a speech teacher or coach elected to serve as a sectional chairman. Board members are elected by schools within the district or section for three-year terms. District chairmen and sectional chairmen may be re-elected.

In October, 1968 elections will be held in the following districts and section:

An election in the Superior District is necessary this October because of Mr. Gordon L. Nelson's resignation from the Board of Control last May. When Mr. Nelson resigned, for reasons of health and increased professional obligations, the Board appointed Mr. Lloyd Qualley, District Administrator at Park Falls, to serve as Chairman of the Superior District until a special election could be held in the fall. In this election a district chairman will be selected to fill the two years of Mr. Nelson's unexpired term.

Calendar of Contest Dates

At its spring meeting in Madison last May the Board of Control adopted a calendar of contest dates for 1972-73 which become a part of the WHSFA five-year calendar. This five-year calendar is printed on page 5 of this *Newsletter*. The contest calendar for 1968-69 is also printed on the inside of the front cover for easy reference.

By publishing the WHSFA contest dates five years in advance it is hoped that conflicts with other activities may be avoided. Conflicts with the State Speech Contest in April are especially critical because of the large number of contestants involved and because of the distances some students must travel.

Drama Contest

For the past two years the state office has published a list of Recommended Plays instead of a list of Approved Plays. The policy of permitting a school to use any play it wishes in the drama contest was on trial in 1966-67 and 1967-68.

Mrs. Julia Mailer, Speech Consultant, and Prof. Edward L. Kamarck, Advisor in Drama, reviewed the titles of plays selected during the two-year trial period and compared them with those chosen during the two previous years when the list of Approved Plays was in force. In the opinion of Mrs. Mailer and Prof. Kamarck, giving greater freedom of choice did not cause an appreciable decline in the quality of the plays selected. This considered opinion caused the Committee on Contests to recommend to the Board of Control at its meeting last fall that having a list of Recommended Plays be adopted as a regular policy, starting in 1968-69. The recommendation of the committee was adopted.

This change to permit greater freedom in the choice of plays does *not* eliminate the necessity for a school to send to the secretary-treasurer the name and author of the play chosen on or before *October 1*. In fact, the Board made this requirement more stringent by enacting the following rule at its meeting last May: *Any school which does not submit the name of its play, or the names of those in preparation, by October 1 shall be ineligible to participate in the drama contest.*

Two other rule changes made by the Board at its meetings last year deserve attention. The restriction that each school be permitted to enter only one play in WHSFA drama competition now applies specifically to *sub-district* contests as well as to district, sectional and state. Beginning this year there will also be a limitation on the set-up time for each play. The new rule states: *Set-up time for each play in a WHSFA contest, at all levels of competition, shall be a uniform 10 minutes. No additional time is allowed for striking the set of the previous play.* The new rules for the drama contest will be found in the Supplementary Rules for Drama in this *Newsletter*.

Debate Contest

OFFICIAL WHSFA DEBATE PROPOSITION FOR 1968-69

Resolved: That the United States should establish a system of compulsory service for all citizens.

The four issues of *The Forensic Quarterly*, published by the Committee on Discussion and Debate of the National University Extension Association, will be sent to all schools planning to enter debate. Other materials which the state office receives from the Committee on Discussion and Debate will also be sent to those schools which indicated on their WHSFA membership registration card an intention to participate in debate.

At the fall meeting of the Board of Control last year, the secretary-treasurer was instructed to poll all the member schools participating in the 1967-68 debate program to get their reaction to changing the state debate tournament so that a single first-place winner would be determined. Such a referendum was conducted in March with ballots being sent to 133 schools. Also included on the ballot was a question asking whether the cross-examination type of debating should be substituted for the standard type.

Of the 82 ballots returned, 52 favored changing the state debate tournament in order to determine a single first-place winner. In response to the second question, 43 of the 82 responses favored retaining the standard type of debating.

At its May 2-3, 1968 meeting, the Board voted to continue the use of the standard type of debating in all levels of competition at this time. However, a new structure for the state debate tournament was adopted, one in which a single first-place winner will be selected. The Supplementary Rules for Debate in this *Newsletter* contain a description of the method for determining the winner.

Speech Contest

The spring forensic program is the largest activity sponsored by the WHSFA. It provides students an opportunity to participate in a variety of events and compete with talent from the entire state. Beginning with local contests, students are selected on the basis of excellence for participation in the district and state contests.

Detailed information about the different contest events will be found in the *WHSFA Contest Handbook*, two copies of which are mailed to each member school. Specific rules governing each event are published in this *Newsletter* in the Supplementary Rules for each contest.

Speech Institutes

The program of the Wisconsin High School Forensic Association receives the support of colleges and universities in the state in a number of ways. The departments of speech in several universities sponsor institutes and workshops for high school students and coaches.

Shown below are those institutes reported to the state office in response to an inquiry sent out last spring. Should you know of an institute which is not listed, please let the secretary-treasurer know so the WHSFA can aid in publicizing it.

Independent Debate Tournaments

Besides the WHSFA debate contests, there are a number of independent high school debate tournaments sponsored each year in Wisconsin. These not only give high school debaters additional experience but often afford training in a different type of debating, particularly the cross-examination style. The Board of Control is aware of the value which comes from a variety of debate experiences; at the same time it believes that introducing new forms of debating in the WHSFA program at the present time might discourage schools which have just entered, or are about to enter, debate competition.

At the meeting of the Board held in Madison last May, a decision was reached "that the WHSFA continue to use the traditional type of debating in all levels of competition at this time." This action was followed by the passage of another motion, "that the WHSFA encourage the use of the cross-examination type of debating in practice tournaments."

The following is a list of independent tournaments to be sponsored this coming year. It includes the proposed schedule given to the state office by the Wisconsin Debate Coaches Association last spring and published in the *WHSFA Newsletter* in May. Also in the list are several additional tournaments reported in response to inquiries sent out by the state office.

In the listing which follows, information given in parentheses indicates the level of competition: A for experienced debaters, B for intermediate, C for beginning. The type of debating is also identified: *Standard* for the traditional four constructive speeches followed by four rebuttal speeches, and *Cross X* for the cross-examination style.

If your school plans to host an independent debate tournament this year and it is not shown below, please notify the state office. We will provide whatever publicity we can.

Part II

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

CONSTITUTION OF THE
WISCONSIN HIGH SCHOOL FORENSIC ASSOCIATION

Article I. Name

The name of this organization shall be the Wisconsin High School Forensic Association.

Article II. Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be:

- to promote forensic activities in the high schools of Wisconsin.
- to stimulate an interest in dramatics, debate, and other forms of speech work.
- to improve the quality of high school speech work.
- to provide channels for inter-school activity in forensics.

Article III. Membership

SECTION 1. Any public or private high school in Wisconsin may become a member by making written application to the secretary-treasurer of the Board of Control and paying the annual dues.

SECTION 2. Any public high school in Upper Michigan will be admitted to membership by making written application to the secretary-treasurer of the Board of Control and paying the annual dues, provided:

- its application is approved by a majority of the member schools in the district to which such school requests to be assigned.
- membership of such applicant be limited to affiliation with one state organization.
- the application has the approval of the Michigan High School Forensic Association Council.

SECTION 3. The annual dues shall be determined by the Board of Control. The membership year shall be from September 1 to August 31.

Article IV. Administration

SECTION 1. Officers.

- The officers of the Association shall be the ~~one~~ ^{three} district chairmen and the three sectional chairmen. These ~~twelve~~ ^{three} officers shall be the Board of Control of the Association.
- The officers of the Board of Control shall be a chairman and a secretary-treasurer.
- The chairman shall be elected annually by the Board of Control for a term of one year.
- The secretary-treasurer shall be a member of the University Extension Department of Speech of the University of Wisconsin. The secretary-treasurer shall be the principal administrative officer of the Association.

SECTION 2. Board of Control.

- The affairs of the Association shall be administered by the Board of Control.
- The district chairmen shall be school administrators, elected by the member schools of their respective districts. Each district chairman shall be responsible for conducting forensic affairs of his district in accordance with Association regulations. Each district chairman shall make reports of the district contests to the secretary-treasurer.

Amendment

- c. Each district chairman shall organize for his district an executive committee, consisting of:
 - (1) one representative from a Wisconsin State University, and
 - (2) one high school principal, and
 - (3) two coaches or teachers of speech.
- d. The three sectional chairmen shall be speech coaches elected by the member schools of their respective sections. Each sectional chairman shall be responsible for conducting forensic affairs of his section. Each sectional chairman shall report promptly the results of his sectional contests to the secretary-treasurer.
- e. The term of office of the members of the Board shall be three years, or until a successor is elected. The term of office of members of the Board of Control shall begin on the date on which the election is completed.
- f. The office of chairman of any district or section shall be declared vacant when the incumbent of that office:
 - (1) moves to another district or section, or
 - (2) leaves the profession, or
 - (3) absents himself from two consecutive board meetings without a reason acceptable to a majority of the Board.
- ✓ g. In case of a vacancy in a district or sectional chairmanship the remaining members of the Board of Control shall appoint a chairman to serve until the next annual election.
- h. The duties of the Board of Control shall be to direct generally all the affairs of the Association and to enact the rules which shall govern the activities of the Association.
- i. The Board shall meet annually as soon as convenient after the annual election of district and sectional chairmen. Seven members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.
- j. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the chairman or by the secretary-treasurer, or must be called by the secretary-treasurer upon request of any five members of the Board of Control.

SECTION 3. Sections, Districts, and Sub-Districts.

- a. For administrative purposes the state shall be divided into the sections and districts as follows:

- ✓ b. Any school may transfer from one district to another by securing written approval from the secretary-treasurer and from the chairmen of the two districts concerned.
 - c. ~~Any three or more schools within a district, or any two schools having a combined enrollment of 800 or more pupils, may form a sub-district. Formation of sub-districts and arrangement of sub-district activities must be approved by the district chairman. The chairman of a district shall be empowered to set up sub-districts in his district, all schools within a sub-district being members of the same district. In setting up sub-districts the district chairman shall consult with the executive committee of his district.~~
- SECTION 4. Elections.
- a. Each member school shall be entitled to one vote for its district chairman, one vote for its sectional chairman and one on any question submitted for a referendum.

- b. The election of district chairmen shall be conducted in the following manner:
 - (1) The primary election. On or before September 15, the secretary-treasurer shall mail a primary ballot to each member school in the districts in which a chairman is to be elected. Each member school may nominate one administrator for district chairman. Primary ballots shall be returned to the secretary-treasurer on or before October 1. The two administrators who receive the highest number of votes shall be declared the nominees for that district. In case of a tie for second place on the primary ballots, all persons so tied shall be considered nominees. If any nominee receives a majority of the primary votes cast in a district, such nominee shall be declared elected by the secretary-treasurer.
 - (2) Final ballot. On or before October 10, the secretary-treasurer shall mail a final ballot to each member school in the districts in which a chairman is to be elected. The ballot shall list the nominees in alphabetical order. Final ballots shall be returned to the secretary-treasurer on or before October 20. The nominee receiving the highest number of votes on the final ballot shall be declared elected. In case of a tie, the chairman of the Board shall appoint a disinterested person to determine the election by lot.
- c. The election of the sectional chairmen shall be conducted by the secretary-treasurer in a manner corresponding to the method of election of district chairmen.

Article V. Constitution and Standing Rules

SECTION 1. The articles governing the Association shall be the Constitution and the Standing Rules.

SECTION 2. Amendments.

- a. Amendments to the Constitution may be initiated by the Board of Control at any regular or special meeting, or by the secretary-treasurer upon petition from 25 member schools.
- b. Ratification of Amendments. After being initiated as required above, a proposed amendment must be submitted to a referendum of all member schools. Ballots must be returned within 30 days after being mailed by the secretary-treasurer. If approved by a majority of schools voting in the referendum, the proposed amendment must be ratified at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Control in order to be declared adopted. Any adopted amendment to the Constitution shall be published in the next issue of the WHSFA Newsletter.

SECTION 3. Standing Rules.

The Standing Rules may be changed or amended by a majority vote of the Board of Control at any regular or special meeting.

STANDING RULES

I. General Rules

1. Membership.

The membership year of the Association shall begin on September 1. The annual dues must be paid on or before October 1. A school which fails to pay its dues by October 1 may not participate in any Association activity.
2. Student Eligibility.
 - a. Any bona fide pupil who is in regular attendance in the 9th, 10th, 11th, or 12th grade, and not beyond the 8th semester of high school, is eligible to compete in Association activities, provided that he or she:
 - (1) has been taking not less than 20 hours of regular school work from the first 15 days of the semester in which the contest is scheduled, and
 - (2) has an average standing for all school work equal at least to a passing mark, with not more than one grade below passing, irrespective of the number of classes carried, and
 - (3) has earned at least three credits during the last semester in which he attended school.

- b. Student eligibility blanks must be sent to the chairman one week prior to each sub-district contest, or to the chairman of the first contest beyond the local contest.

3. Coaches.

Drama, debate, and speech coaches must be licensed teachers of the school.

4. Dues.

The dues structure for 1968-69 shall be:

- \$15 for schools with an enrollment of 149 or less.
- \$25 for schools with an enrollment of 150 to ~~399~~ 349.
- \$30 for schools with an enrollment of 350 or more.

5. Contests.

The Association shall sponsor the following contest activities:

- a. Drama
- b. Debate
- c. Speech
 - Extemporaneous Speaking
 - Four-minute Speech
 - Original Oratory
 - Public Address
 - *Significant Speeches
 - Interpretative Reading of Poetry
 - Interpretative Reading of Prose
 - Memorized Declamation
 - *Play Acting

6. Contest Committee.

The contest committee shall determine:

- a. the fee for judging.
- b. the admission fee.
- c. the registration fee.
- d. the order of contestants, except that insofar as possible it be by the drawing of lots.

7. Contest Regulations.

- a. Sub-district contests shall be interpreted to mean contests open to 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grade students.
- b. The maximum number of contestants each school may enter in each event of sub-district speech contests shall be two, except in play acting where one entry of two to five persons in the cast may be made by each participating school.
- c. No school or contestant may participate in any official contest of the Association without actually attending the contest in person.
- d. No student shall represent his school in the same year in more than one event of the spring speech contest.
- e. Participants awarded A in the spring speech contests (beginning with the sub-district) are eligible to proceed to the next contest. The order of contests shall be sub-district, district and state. Individual awards shall not be given by the WHSFA at district contests.
- f. Schools awarded A in the drama contests (beginning with the sub-district) are eligible to proceed to the next contest. The order of contests shall be sub-district, district, sectional and state.
 - (1) If sub-district drama contests are held within a forensic district, each competing school in this district must be judged and receive an A award at the sub-district level before it may proceed to the district contest. By agreement with the forensic district chairman, a single-school entry in a

* After a two-year trial period, Significant Speeches and Play Acting were adopted as regular WHSFA contests by the Board of Control at its spring meeting on May 2-3, 1968.

sub-district drama contest must be judged by a judge or judges satisfactory to the district chairman. If the school is awarded an A in such judging, it may proceed to the district contest.

- (2) If a school is the only entry in a district drama contest, before it can compete at the sectional level it must be judged by judges satisfactory to the chairman of the forensic district in which the school is located. This school must receive an A award in such judging before it may progress to the sectional contest.
- (3) A school desiring to qualify for a district drama contest may, with the approval of its own district chairman, request the chairman of an adjacent forensic district for permission to be assigned to a sub-district contest in this adjacent district.
- (4) Individual drama awards shall not be given at the sub-district, district or sectional level of the WHSFA. A Certificate of Achievement shall be given to schools awarded an A at the district and sectional contests.

- g. Member schools may participate with non-member schools, but such participation shall not be considered in the determination of eligibility for Certificates of Participation.
- h. Each school entering debate competition sponsored by the Association must participate in a district tournament. (See Supplementary Rule for Debate 6a.)

8. Judges and Judging.

- a. Each contest shall be judged by one or more judges. By agreement of the majority of the participating schools, the coaches may act as judges of these contests. No coach shall judge his own contestants. The judge or judges shall grade each play in a drama contest A, B, or C, and shall grade each participant in a speech contest A, B, or C, according to merit, possibly having several of the same grade or none of some grades. All those graded A shall be eligible to go on to the next contest. If several judges are used, the mean of their ratings shall be the final grade. In judging a debate the judge shall declare which of the teams, affirmative or negative, won the debate.

9. State Contest Registration Fees.

- a. The registration fees for the state contests shall be as follows:

Drama	\$35 per school.
Debate	\$35 per school.
Speech	\$5 per contestant.

- b. The fees for each state contest shall be paid to the secretary-treasurer when the registration for that contest is made.

10. Awards.

The number and kind of awards at state contests shall be determined annually by the Board of Control.

- *a. Any student who participates in a WHSFA sub-district, district, sectional, or state contest is eligible to receive a Certificate of Participation. The principal of each school wishing to award participation certificates shall order from the secretary-treasurer, on an order blank sent out by the state office, the number and kind of certificates needed: drama, debate, speech.

- b. At the state contests the following awards shall be given:

c. Non-participating alternates in debate will not receive medals.

II. Supplementary Rules for Drama

- *1. A school wishing to enter the drama contest may select its play from any source; however, a choice from the list of Recommended Plays compiled by the state office is strongly urged.
- *2. Authors of original plays to be entered in the drama contest may send their play manuscripts to the Advisor in Drama, Prof. Edward L. Kamarck, for his counsel and advice.
- †3. The name and author of the play chosen must be sent to the secretary-treasurer on or before October 1 so a list of entries can be compiled. If the final choice of a play has not been determined by October 1, the names of those in preparation shall be submitted. *Any school which does not submit the name of its play, or the names of those in preparation, by October 1 shall be ineligible to participate in the drama contest.*
4. There is no rule which restricts the use of a given play to one school in each district.
5. Sectional contests in drama will be held.
- #6. Each school shall be permitted to enter only one play in a sub-district, district, or sectional contest.
- †7. *Set-up time for each play in a WHSFA contest, at all levels of competition, shall be a uniform 10 minutes. No additional time is allowed for striking the set of the previous play.*
8. Production time shall not exceed 35 minutes. The contest chairman shall appoint an official timekeeper who shall be stationed back-stage and should order the curtain pulled at the end of the 35 minutes. Being stopped shall in no way affect the rating.
9. Schools receiving A awards in district and sectional dramatic competition shall be given Certificates of Achievement. These certificates are to be provided by the state Association and delivered to district and sectional chairmen as required. The recipient schools shall be responsible for entering the specific data on the forms provided.
 (See General Rule 7f for regulations concerning the order of drama contests.)

III. Supplementary Rules for Debate

- *1. The official WHSFA debate proposition for 1968-69 is: *Resolved: That the United States should establish a system of compulsory service for all citizens.* The general problem area for discussion and debate in 1968-69 is: "How can the United States best maintain manpower for an effective defense system?"
 - ††2. *The Forensic Quarterly* of the Committee on Discussion and Debate of the National University Extension Association shall be the official handbook of the Association.
- * After a two-year trial period, the use of a list of Recommended Plays instead of a list of Approved Plays was adopted by the Board of Control at its fall meeting on October 31-November 1, 1967. This action necessitated changes in the wording of the first two rules.
- † These rule changes were adopted by the Board of Control at its spring meeting on May 2-3, 1968.
- # This rule change was adopted by the Board of Control at its fall meeting on October 31-November 1, 1967.
- **The 1968-69 WHSFA debate proposition was selected through a preferential referendum conducted by the state office in April 1968. All schools which participated in debate in 1967-68 received ballots.
- ††The change in the wording of this rule acknowledges a change in the title of the publication.

3. Each school shall certify in advance of the contest a team for each of the rounds of the contest. This team shall consist of two affirmative and two negative debaters and may also have one or two alternates. If two, one must be designated affirmative alternate and one negative alternate. The alternates shall attend only those debates in which their team is participating. They may not participate in the debate in any way except in case of illness of a debater. No debater shall participate on both sides in the same debate contest.
4. The order of debating shall be: constructive speeches—affirmative, negative, affirmative, negative; rebuttal speeches—negative, affirmative, negative, affirmative.
5. Time.
 - a. Constructive speeches shall not exceed ten minutes; rebuttal speeches shall not exceed five minutes.
 - b. There shall be an official timekeeper for each debate.
 - c. Time cards shall be used for all contest debates. The timekeeper shall be seated in full view of the debaters, facing them, and shall display time cards to indicate at one-minute intervals the amount of time remaining for each debater. There shall also be a card to indicate when only one-half minute remains.
 - d. The timekeeper shall rise and remain standing at the full expiration of time for both constructive and rebuttal speeches. When the timekeeper rises, the debater shall complete only the sentence already begun. If he continues beyond that sentence the judge shall stop him. Being stopped shall not in any way affect the decision.
 - e. The affirmative team shall provide time cards for each debate.
6. Tournaments.
 - a. District Tournaments. Each district shall hold a debate tournament of three rounds if there are seven or more member schools in the district wishing to compete in debate. If there are fewer than seven such schools, the district chairman shall arrange to have them compete in a tournament of another district within the same section. Any school which achieves a record of four wins and two losses, or better, in the district tournament shall be eligible to participate in the sectional tournament.
 - b. Sectional Tournaments. Each section shall hold a debate tournament of three rounds. Any school which achieves a record of four wins and two losses, or better, in the sectional tournament shall be eligible to participate in the state tournament.
 - *c. State Tournament. There shall be a state tournament structured to determine a single first-place winner through the following elimination process: After three rounds of debate, all teams with a record of four wins and two losses, or better, shall advance to a quarter-final round; winners in the quarter finals shall advance to a semi-final round; winners in the semi-finals shall be judged by a panel of three judges. The finals shall be judged by a panel of five judges.
 - d. In the event that any debate squad shall not be present at the time of drawing, the contest manager shall draw for that squad.
 - e. If any squad has not appeared by the scheduled starting time, the other debates shall proceed as scheduled. If the tardy squad is ready to debate within 15 minutes of the scheduled starting time, it shall be allowed to proceed without prejudice or penalty with no reduction of time allowed for presentations and rebuttals. If the tardy squad is not ready within 15 minutes of the scheduled starting time, it shall forfeit the round to the opposition.
 - f. Unless the contest manager has good reason to believe that a squad which did not appear for the first round will be ready to debate at the beginning of the second round, he shall, during the first round, re-schedule the succeeding rounds. Ten minutes before the second round, he shall post the original schedule if the late squad has arrived, or the revised schedule if

the late squad has not arrived. No change shall be made after the posting of schedules.

- g. If the late squad has missed the first two rounds, it shall be ineligible to enter any succeeding rounds.
7. All schools which qualify to pass from the district to the sectional and from the sectional to the state debate contests shall be given Certificates of Achievement. These certificates are to be provided by the state office and delivered to district and sectional chairmen as required. The recipient schools shall be responsible for entering the specific data on the forms provided.
8. Coaches are asked not to attend any but the final round of debate at the state contest.
9. The order of participation in district, sectional, and state debate contests shall be determined by the drawing of lots at the beginning of the contest.
10. Judges at the debate contests are asked to submit brief written comments for each debate on forms provided by the state office.

IV. Supplementary Rules for Extemporaneous Speaking

1. Selections may not be more than eight minutes. The official timekeeper shall use time cards to indicate the passage of each minute of time; he shall stand and remain standing at the end of eight minutes; the participant shall complete only the sentence already begun. If the participant continues further the judge shall stop him, but being stopped shall in no way affect the rating. There is no minimum time requirement.
2. The host school shall provide the time cards.
3. The periodicals from which topics (not titles) will be taken are the January, February, March, and April issues of *American Observer*, *Current History*, *Newsweek*, *Senior Scholastic*, and *U. S. News and World Report*.
4. For the state contest the secretary-treasurer shall select twenty to thirty topics (not titles) and write each such topic on a card. One hour before participation the contestant may draw five cards, choose a topic, and return four cards before the next contestant chooses. The same plan should be followed for all preliminary contests, substituting for secretary-treasurer, a person satisfactory to the participating schools.
5. A contestant may bring to the preparation hour his own magazines and dictionary, but no written or typed notes or outlines. In the presentation he may speak from notes prepared during the preparation hour. A contestant's notes shall be restricted to one 4x6 note card. The student may use both sides of the card for notes if he wishes. The host school shall provide uniform distinctive paper for participants to use in the preparation hour, and distinctive 4x6 note cards.
6. At the conclusion of each contest in extemporaneous speaking the judge may ask one or more pertinent questions of each participant, or he may designate any other person in the audience, at his discretion, to question the speaker.
7. Properties, or visual materials, may not be used in presenting an extemporaneous speech.

V. Supplementary Rules for Four-minute Speech

1. The speech is to be written by the student on any contemporary problem.
2. Speeches shall be limited to four minutes. The timekeeper (or judge) shall give warning at the end of three minutes by raising his hand; he shall stand and remain standing at the end of four minutes, and the participant shall complete only the sentence already begun. If he continues further the judge shall stop him. Being stopped shall in no way affect the rating. There is no minimum time requirement.
3. Properties, or visual materials, may not be used in presenting a four-minute speech.

VI. Supplementary Rules for Original Oratory

1. The oration is to be written by the contestant who presents it.
2. Each oration shall not exceed eight minutes in length. The official timekeeper (or judge) shall stand and remain standing at the expiration of eight minutes, and the contestant shall complete only the sentence already begun. If he continues beyond that sentence the judge shall stop him. Being stopped shall in no way affect the rating.
3. There is no minimum time for orations. The discretion as to whether the length is suitable is left to the judge.
4. A student may not use the same oration more than one school year.
5. Properties, or visual materials, may not be used in presenting an oration.

VII. Supplementary Rules for Public Address

1. The Public Address general problem area for 1968-69 is: *What approaches to preventing racial disorders can best serve the people of the United States?*
 - a. For the sub-district contest the specific area will be: *What can the government do to prevent racial disorders?*
 - b. For the district contest the specific area will be: *What can education do to prevent racial disorders?*
 - c. For the state contest the specific area will be: *What can individuals do to prevent racial disorders?*
2. A speech in this contest shall be not more than eight minutes in length. At the end of eight minutes the official timekeeper or judge shall stand and remain standing and the contestant shall complete only the sentence already begun. If he continues beyond that point, the judge shall stop him. Being stopped shall in no way affect the rating. There is no minimum time requirement.
3. The speech may not be read from manuscript.
4. Note cards may be used.
5. At the sub-district, district, and state contests the student must deliver a speech based on the specific area, or topic, designated for that contest level.
6. A student may not use the same specific area, or topic, in more than one contest.
7. Properties, or visual materials, may not be used in presenting a speech in the Public Address contest.

VIII. Supplementary Rules for Significant Speeches

1. For this contest a student will select a single speech which has historical or contemporary significance and interpret that speech for his listeners.
2. The total length of a contestant's presentation in this contest shall be no more than eight minutes. At the end of that time the timekeeper (or judge) shall stand and remain standing and the participant shall complete only the sentence already begun. If he continues further the judge shall stop him. Being stopped shall in no way affect the rating. There is no minimum time requirement.
3. In his presentation the contestant will give pertinent information about the speaker, the audience, and the occasion on which the speech was delivered. He will also tell why he believes the speech was significant for the original audience and has significance for persons in his audience. The contestant's original portion of the presentation should constitute approximately two to four minutes of the eight minutes at his disposal.
4. As part of his presentation the contestant will also deliver a selected portion, or portions, of the speech of significance he has chosen. The contestant may position the quoted material wherever he wishes in his presentation.

5. The entire presentation is to be delivered from memory.
6. Properties, or visual materials, may not be used in presenting a speech in the Significant Speeches contest.

IX. Supplementary Rules for Interpretative Reading of Poetry

1. This contest shall be limited to the prepared reading of poetry from the printed page with the optional use of a reading stand. The selection is not to be memorized.
2. There is no list of prohibited readings.
3. Interpretative readings may not be more than eight minutes in length, including any introductory or expository remarks by the reader. The official timekeeper or judge shall stand and remain standing at the expiration of eight minutes and the participant shall complete only the sentence already begun. If he continues beyond that sentence the judge shall stop him. Being stopped shall in no way affect the rating. There is no minimum time requirement.
4. A student may use the same selection(s) in more than one contest in any given year of contest competition.
5. Costumes and properties such as chairs, kerchiefs, flags, etc. may not be used in interpretative reading of poetry.

X. Supplementary Rules for Interpretative Reading of Prose

1. This contest shall be limited to the prepared reading of prose from the printed page with the optional use of a reading stand. The selection is not to be memorized.
2. There is no list of prohibited readings.
3. Interpretative readings of prose may not be more than eight minutes in length, including any introductory or expository remarks by the reader. The official timekeeper or judge shall stand and remain standing at the expiration of eight minutes and the participant shall complete only the sentence already begun. If he continues beyond that sentence the judge shall stop him. Being stopped shall in no way affect the rating. There is no minimum time requirement.
4. A student may use the same selection(s) in more than one contest in any given year of contest competition.
5. Costumes and properties such as chairs, kerchiefs, flags, etc. may not be used in interpretative reading of prose.

XI. Supplementary Rules for Memorized Declamation

1. There is no list of prohibited declamations.
2. Declamations shall not exceed eight minutes in length. The timekeeper (or judge) shall stand and remain standing at the expiration of eight minutes, and the contestant shall complete only the sentence just begun. If he continues beyond that sentence the judge shall stop him. Being stopped shall in no way affect the rating.
3. There is no minimum time for declamations. The discretion as to whether the length is suitable is left to the judge.
4. There is no rule prohibiting a student from changing his declamation as he progresses from one contest to the next.
5. A student may not use the same selection more than one school year.
6. Declamations may be humorous or non-humorous, but only one contest shall be held, termed *Memorized Declamation*.
7. Costumes and properties such as chairs, kerchiefs, flags, etc. may not be used in presenting a declamation.

XII. Supplementary Rules for Play Acting

1. In this event a group comprised of two to five contestants will present a scene from a play, without costumes, make-up, lights, or properties other than an available table (or desk as a substitute) and chairs, if the scene requires them. Hand props as well as stage props, other than those mentioned, are prohibited.
2. Music and sound effects are not permitted.
3. Lines are to be spoken from memory and contestants are encouraged to move as they would in a fully-produced play.
4. Only one entry of two to five persons will be permitted from each school.
5. Each contestant in the group shall portray only one character.
6. There is no list of approved or prohibited plays for this contest. A choice from the list of Recommended Plays is suggested.
7. The time of the presentation shall not exceed 15 minutes. This includes the remarks the group may choose to make in introducing or explaining the scene it has chosen. At the expiration of 15 minutes, the timekeeper (or judge) shall stand and remain standing and the contestant speaking shall complete only the sentence already begun. If he continues beyond that sentence the judge shall stop him. Being stopped shall in no way affect the rating.
8. There is no rule prohibiting a group from changing its play as it advances from one contest to the next.
9. In the event that one of the group is unable to appear at a contest, the coach may substitute any other eligible student.
10. The registration fee for this event at the state contest is \$5.00 for each member of the group.
11. A presentation in this contest shall be judged as a whole, but each participant shall receive identical individual awards.

PART IV

ANNUAL REPORT

The September issue of the WHSFA *Newsletter* is historical in nature, giving an account of the Association's activities during the previous year. Besides recording the membership of the Board of Control and presenting the 1967-68 financial statement of the state office, this section of the *Newsletter* reports the achievement of contestants. Of special interest are the participation summaries on pages 39, 50, and 72. These reveal the large number of students in Wisconsin high schools who benefitted from the program of the WHSFA last year.

BOARD OF CONTROL

In the fall of 1967, elections were held to fill five vacancies on the Board of Control; four of these vacancies were the result of normal expiration of terms of office. In the elections, four members of the Board were re-elected for three-year terms which will run to 1970.

Mrs. Marylou Patterson, teacher of speech and debate coach at Eau Claire Memorial High School, was again selected to be Chairman of the Northern Section. She was first elected to the Board in 1964.

Mr. Walter J. Mountin, Principal of Oak Creek High School, was re-elected as Chairman of the Milwaukee District. Mr. Mountin had served on the Board for one year prior to the election last fall, completing the unexpired term of Mr. Frank Sirianni of Menomonee Falls, who had resigned.

Mr. J. C. Gillmann, Administrator of Marathon Public Schools, was again elected to be Chairman of the Stevens Point District. He first became a member of the Board in 1956 and has held both the offices of Vice-Chairman and Chairman. He is now Chairman of the Board.

Mr. Gordon L. Nelson, Administrator of Maple Public Schools, was chosen again to be Chairman of the Superior District in the elections last fall. He came to the Board initially in 1961, serving as Vice-Chairman for several years. At the meeting of the Board of Control last May, Mr. Nelson submitted his resignation for reasons of health and increased professional obligations. The Board accepted his resignation and appointed Mr. Lloyd Qualley, Administrator of Park Falls Public Schools, to serve as Chairman of the Superior District for the remainder of the year.

A special election was held last fall in the Eau Claire District to select a chairman to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Arthur D. Spoolman, formerly Principal of Cumberland High School and now Administrator of Hayward Public Schools. Since Hayward is not in the Eau Claire District, Mr. Spoolman resigned from the Board at the close of 1966-67 when he took over his new position. Mr. N. F. Panzenhagen, Administrator of Cadott Public Schools, was elected to be Chairman of the Eau Claire District for 1967-68. Before the election he had served for two months as acting chairman of the district, at the request of the Board.

Last year the Board of Control held its two regular meetings, one in November and one in May. The major items of business conducted at these meetings is reported in the November 1967 and May 1968 Newsletters; however, if any WHSFA member would like the complete record of the Board meetings, copies of the minutes are available through the state office of the Association.


